INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

Carmignac Portfolio Flexible Bond is an international fixed income UCITS fund that implements interest rate and credit strategies globally while systematically hedging currency risk. Its flexible and opportunistic style enables the Fund to deploy a non-benchmarked, conviction-driven allocation strategy across global bond markets. The Fund is managed with a total return approach, seeking to capture market upswings while hedging against downside risk. It promotes environmental and social characteristics and aims to outperform its reference indicator over a recommended minimum investment horizon of three years.

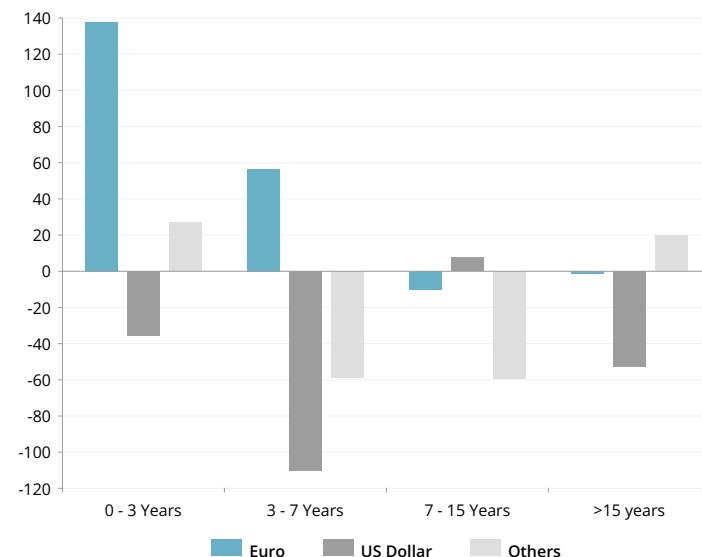

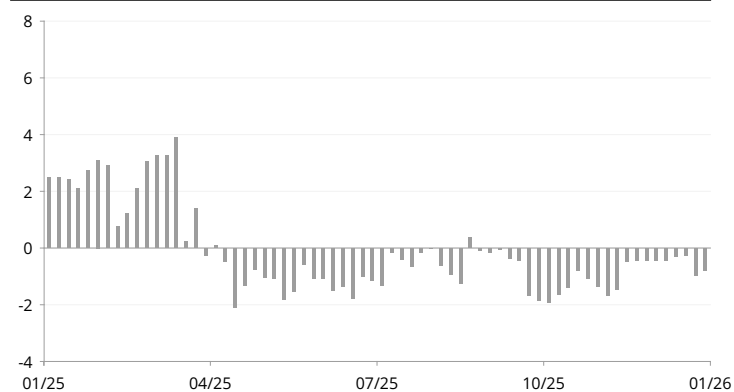

FUND MANAGEMENT ANALYSIS



MARKET ENVIRONMENT

- January was marked by increased geopolitical tensions, fueling the rebound in commodities. Notable events include the capture of Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro by the United States, Donald Trump's pressure on Europe regarding Greenland, and the escalation of US-Iranian tensions amid the stalemate in negotiations over Tehran's nuclear program.
- In the United States, the Federal Reserve maintained its key interest rate at 3.75%, marking a pause in its rate-cutting cycle. Producer prices accelerated more than expected due to the impact of tariffs, while economic activity remained robust with an upward revision of Q3 GDP to 4.4%. Orders for durable goods and industrial orders were strong, and employment data was reassuring.
- In Europe, inflation surprised slightly on the downside, slowing to 2.0% year-on-year in December. However, the eurozone growth surprised positively with a GDP increase of 0.3% in Q4.
- In Japan, the announcement of early legislative elections by Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi pushed long-term Japanese rates upwards, notably with the 30-year rate rising by +23bps.
- In this context, US rates increased, particularly the 10-year rate, which rose by +7bps, while the German 10-year yield remained stable. Credit markets showed resilience despite the deteriorating geopolitical context with a marginal widening of the iTraxx Xover index by 3bps.



PERFORMANCE COMMENTARY

- The fund generated a positive performance on an absolute and relative basis in January, benefiting from our positions in inflation-indexed instruments.
- Our rate overlay strategies also contributed significantly, particularly our short positions on the long ends of yield curves of developed sovereign issuers.
- The only negative contributor to the fund's performance was our overlay strategies on high-yield credit, although volatility peaked at the end of the period.
- During the month, we increased our short position on French sovereign yields.



OUTLOOK AND INVESTMENT STRATEGY

- The current environment presents many uncertainties, particularly on the geopolitical front, which could lead to greater volatility in risky assets.
- The market appears pessimistic about the US economic outlook, thus incorporating strong rate cut expectations. On the other hand, the market is much more optimistic about the growth potential of the euro area, with no rate cuts anticipated from the ECB for the next twelve months.
- The inflation trajectory seems to be upward across the Atlantic following the decisions of the US administration on tariffs and also on migration policy.
- Based on these observations, we maintain a negative modified duration while maintaining a strong appetite for inflation-linked products. On the credit front, we maintain protections across the high-yield bond spectrum given the current level of valuation and the potential risk of widening credit spreads.

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PORTFOLIO ESG SUMMARY

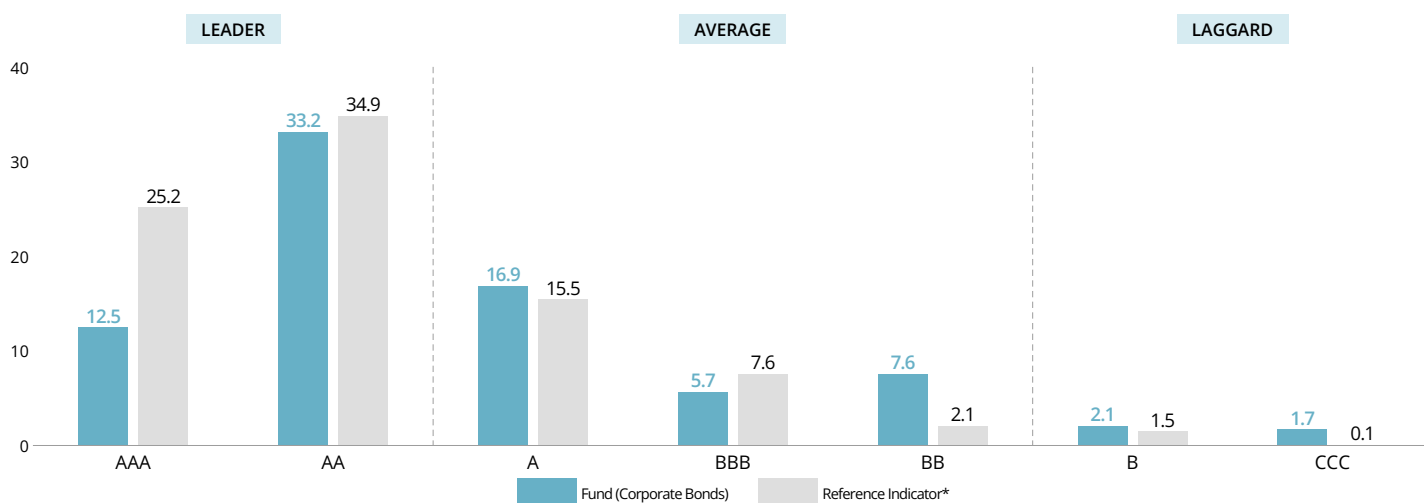

MARKETING COMMUNICATION

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GLOSSARY

Duration: A bond's duration is the period beyond which interest rate variations will no longer affect its return. The duration is like a discounted average lifetime of all flows (interest and capital).

High yield: A loan or bond rated below investment grade because of its higher default risk. The return on these securities is generally higher.

Investment grade: A loan or bond that rating agencies have rated AAA to BBB-, generally indicating relatively low default risk.

Investment/net exposure rate: The investment rate constitutes the volume of assets invested expressed as a percentage of the portfolio. Adding the impact of the derivatives to this investment rate results in the net exposure rate, which corresponds to the real percentage of asset exposure to a certain risk. Derivatives can be used to increase the underlying asset's exposure (stimulation) or reduce it (hedging).

Modified duration: A bond's modified duration measures the risk attached to a given change in the interest rate. Modified duration of +2 means that for an instantaneous 1% rate increase, the portfolio's value would drop by 2%.

Net asset value: Price of all units (in an FCP) or shares (in a SICAV).

Rating: The rating measures the creditworthiness of a borrower (bond issuer).

SFDR Fund Classification: Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (SFDR) 2019/2088. EU Act that requires asset managers to classify funds into categories, "Article 8" funds promote environmental and social characteristics, "Article 9" funds have sustainable investments as a measurable objective. In addition to not promoting environmental or social characteristics, "Article 6" funds have no sustainable objectives. Sharpe ratio: The Sharpe ratio measures the excess return over the risk-free rate divided by the standard deviation of this return. It thus shows the marginal return per unit of risk. When it is positive, the higher the Sharpe ratio, the more risk-taking is rewarded. A negative Sharpe ratio does not necessarily mean that the portfolio posted a negative performance, but rather that it performed worse than a risk-free investment.

SICAV: Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable (Open-ended investment company with variable capital)

VaR: Value at Risk (VaR) represents an investor's maximum potential loss on the value of a financial asset portfolio, based on a holding period (20 days) and confidence interval (99%). This potential loss is expressed as a percentage of the portfolio's total assets. It is calculated on the basis of a sample of historical data (over a two-year period).

Volatility: Range of price variation of a security, fund, market or index, which enables the measurement of risk over a given period. It is determined using the standard deviation obtained by calculating the square root of the variance. The variance is obtained by calculating the average deviation from the mean, which is then squared. The greater the volatility, the greater the risk.

Yield to Maturity: Yield to Maturity (YTM) is the estimated annual rate of return expected on a bond if held until maturity and assuming all payments made as scheduled and reinvested at this rate. For perpetual bonds, the next call date is used for computation. Note that the yield shown does not take into account the FX carry and fees and expenses of the portfolio. The portfolio's YTM is the weighted average individual bonds holdings' YTM within the portfolio.

ESG DEFINITIONS & METHODOLOGY

ESG: E for Environment, S for Social, G for Governance

ESG score Calculation: Only the Equity and Corporate Bond holdings of the fund considered. Overall Fund Rating calculated using MSCI Fund ESG Quality Score methodology: excluding cash and non ESG-rated holdings, performing a weighted average of the normalized weights of the holdings and the Industry-Adjusted Score of the holdings, multiplied by (1+Adjustment%) which consists of the weight of positively trending ESG ratings minus the weight of ESG Laggards minus the weight of negatively trending ESG ratings. Principal Adverse Impacts (PAI): Negative, material, or potentially material effects on sustainability factors that result from, worsen, or are directly related to investment choices or advice performed by a legal entity. Examples include GHG emissions and carbon footprint.

Sustainable Investments: The SFDR defines sustainable investment as an investment in an economic activity that contributes to an environmental or social objective, provided that the investment does not significantly harm any environmental or social objective and that the investee companies follow good governance practices.

Taxonomy Alignment: In the context of an individual company, taxonomy alignment is defined as the proportion of a company's revenue that comes from activities that meet certain environmental criteria. In the context of an individual fund or portfolio, alignment is defined as the portfolio-weight weighted average taxonomy alignment of included companies.
